Position Purpose

The purpose of the Membership is to participate in the Association forum to voice or share information, resources, ideas, expertise and as part of the Association support our petitions to local organizations and governments to help accomplish our Association goals. This is accomplished by participating in communication opportunities, events and meetings; as available.

Duties and Responsibilities

The Member is responsible for doing, or making the necessary arrangement for, the following;

- Every Member must uphold the constitution and comply with the Association Bylaws.
- Every Member is responsible for remaining in good standing by paying his or her current annual membership fee, or any other subscription or debt due and owing by the member to the Association.
- Every Member must be prepared to spend the appropriate time to keep up to date on Associations communication and activities appropriate for their businesses; print materials, meeting attendance, website, email, social media pages.

Additional Information

- Membership applications shall be made in writing to the membership committee and signed by the applicant. The application shall include the telephone number, fax number, email address, mailing address of the applicant and shall become the registered address of the applicant, subject to change from time to time.
- The application shall be filed with the membership committee, along with the required dues. The annual dues payable by members shall be determined annually by the Board, subject to ratification vote by simple majority at a General Membership Meeting.
- Membership in the Association shall continue from time of admittance until a member has resigned, been removed from the roll of members pursuant to these Bylaws or fails to pay the annual dues.
- All members are in good standing except a member who has failed to pay his or her current annual membership fee, or any other subscription or debt due and owing by the member to the Association and the member is not in good standing so long as the debt remains unpaid, or has

acted in a manner detrimental to the stated goals, objectives, integrity, and public image of the Association.

• Any member in good standing may submit his/her name for the position of Director to be voted on by those attending the Annual General Meeting.
